3. Description of the training offered:

Trainees have the opportunity to become a Biotech Lab Assistant. Training at Baltimore BioWorks, Inc. (BBWI) operates five days per week over a six week period. Baltimore City Community College's (BCCC) courses are offered in 16 week semesters both Fall and Spring (registration information and start dates can be obtained at www.bccc.edu). Training modules at BBWI and courses at BCCC are taught face-to-face, and include hands-on laboratory and classroom learning.

4. Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:

Upon successful completion of the BBWI Vocational Training program, graduates are assisted in applying for laboratory positions at biotechnology companies in the Baltimore/Washington region. Upon completion of the curriculum pathways at BCCC, students have the opportunity to obtain a Laboratory Animal Sciences, or Biotechnology Certificate and/or an Associates Degree in Biotechnology.

5. Am I eligible?

To be eligible for this training program, applicants must:

- Have a High School Diploma or a GED[®]
- Have basic mathematics skills- a math quiz may be administered for acceptance

- Have some job and internship placement sites
- Be drug free and pass a background check

7. How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment as a Biotech Lab Assistant?

Trainees who complete this program and obtain employment as a Biotech Lab Assistant can expect to start at \$13 - \$19 per hour with advancement opportunities for salaries of \$45,000+ per year.
