#### **1. Organization providing the training:**

#### **2. Physical location where training occurs:**

#### **3. Description of the training offered:**

##### **1. CDL A (Tractor Trailers and anything smaller)**

Students have the opportunity to gain the skills and knowledge to pass the CDL A federal licensure exam. This class includes theory and hands-on training. The class is offered full-time for eight weeks, or part-time on evenings and weekends for ten weeks.

##### **2. CDL B (Dump Trucks and anything smaller) (passenger bus)**

Students have the opportunity to gain the skills and knowledge necessary to pass the CDL B federal licensure qualifications, which may include the passenger endorsement if needed. The class is offered full time for 13 days from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm or part time evenings and weekends.

#### **4. Trainees have the opportunity to earn the following industry-recognized certifications:**

Students taking CDL A become eligible to test for the CDL A license.

Students taking CDL B become eligible to test for the CDL B license.

#### **5. Am I eligible?**

To be eligible for this training program, applicants must:

- Be 18+.
- Be drug free.
- Be able to pass a Department of Transportation physical exam.
- Have a clean driving record.

#### **6. What is the application process?**

**7. How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment in the transportation and logistics field?**

Trainees who complete this program and obtain employment can expect to earn an average of \$55,000 to \$80,000 per year.

**8: How much do I have to pay for this program?**

Full tuition is \$5,045 for CDL A and \$2,200 for CDL B. However, tuition assistance is available through EARN. Typically, accepted applicants will pay about 20% of tuition costs, but this varies depending upon the applicant's financial situation.
