Maryland Pools Payout

Mr. Finneran informed the Commission that due to the recent \$100,000 payout the Guaranty Fund made on behalf of Maryland Pools, the Guaranty Fund balance may be lower in June.

\$100,000 Guaranty Fund Payouts

There are 5 pending cases which will likely exceed the \$100,000 maximum per contractor. If the total claims awarded to homeowners exceeds the \$100,000 cap, the final monetary award paid out to each homeowner shall be paid on a prorated basis.

There was a discussion regarding the use of the names of contractors when discussing pending complaints and when referring to the chart of contractors approaching \$100,000 in Guaranty Fund claims. During the discussion, a question was posed by Commissioner White as to why they could not name the contractors when discussing the status of claims since the MHIC posts the names of the contractors approaching \$100,000 in Guaranty Fund claims on its website. The Commission's counsel responded that an exception to the prohibition on releasing of licensing information about a contractor is that there is a compelling public purpose for the release of such information. It has been determined that there is a compelling public purpose in posting the names of contractors approaching the \$100,000 cap in Guaranty Fund claims, because it alerts homeowners that they must submit a claim before the cutoff date for the receipt of claims against a specific contractor. The discussion of the details of pending claims at the Commission's business meetings often goes beyond what is posted on the website and therefore identifying particular contractors by name should be avoided.

Comments from Executive Director

Mr. Finneran informed the Commission that the Licensing workshops are extremely well attended. The Commission is considering having two workshops a month.

Mr. Finneran informed the Commission that there are two employees out on extended leave. The Commission recently hired a temporary employee.

Mr. Finneran did outreach on March 17, 2018 and March 18, 2018 at Frederick County Building Industry Association Show. Also Mr. Finneran and Ms. Irvin-Cromwell did outreach on March 28, 2018 at Coppin State University. Mr. Finneran would like to do more outreach.

Mr. Finneran informed the Commission that House Bill 674/Senate Bill 1198 pertaining to Home Improvement Contracts did not pass legislation. Also, House Bill 916 pertaining to Home Improvement Contracts-Deposits did not pass legislation.
