RE: Report required by Business Regulation Article §11–213 (MSAR 710, 6526)

Dear Secretary Robinson, Senate President Miller, and Speaker Jones:

On or before September 15 of each year, the Maryland Racing Commission is required to submit a report to the Secretary and the Legislative Policy Committee about the preceding calendar year. The Commission is pleased to present you with the annual report for calendar year 2018.

Each report shall include:

- (1) a statement of receipts and disbursements of the Commission;
- (2) a summary of major events that occurred the preceding year that affected horse racing in the State, including any significant changes at tracks in the region as well as a discussion of legislative initiatives in the State;
- (3) a 5-year assessment of each track regarding:
 - (i) attendance;
 - (ii) purse distributions;
 - (iii) live racing days that are allocated and used;
 - (iv) betting on live racing that is held at that track broken down by the following categories:
 1. betting conducted at the live track;

2. betting conducted at other Maryland tracks;
 3. betting conducted at satellite simulcast facilities in the State; and
 4. betting conducted through out-of-state satellite simulcasting;
- (v) betting that is conducted at the live track on races simulcast from other tracks in the State; and
- (vi) betting that is conducted at the live track on races simulcast from out-of-state tracks;
- (4) information on all simulcast betting at satellite simulcast facilities in the State, including information on how much is wagered on in-state races and how much is bet on out-of-state races;
- (5) information on all simulcast betting that is conducted out-of-state on races being run live in this State;
- (6) to the extent available, information on the breeding industry in the State, including:
- (i) the number of breeders in the State;
 - (ii) the number of foals registered in the State;
 - (iii) the average sales prices of foals; and
 - (iv) any other information pertaining to the regional and national ranking of the State for breeding;
- (7) all other information that is currently provided by the Commission in its annual report;
- (8) additional information on satellite simulcast facilities, as required under § 11-831 of this title; and
- (9) any other information that is useful in explaining the financial viability of horse racing in the State and any recommendations to improve the industry.

A review of this report will give you an overview of the horse racing industry in Maryland.

MEETING STATISTICS - 2018

Commission Meetings

In 2018, the Commission met to conduct business on nine (9) occasions.

Highlights

REVENUE:

\$2,756,033 was collected by the State in 2018. This amount represents an increase from the amount of revenue collected in 2017.

ATTENDANCE:

Attendance at Maryland tracks was 461,487 in 2018. Since attendance is not kept for patronage at Satellite Simulcast Betting Facilities and at remote tracks, recorded attendance alone is not a good measure of activity.

Rosecroft does not keep a record of attendance.

Legislation

Chapter 184 (HB 1721/ SB 1158) – Altered the restricted use of funding for The Maryland International and changed it from a Grade 1 race to a graded race.

Chapter 522 (HB 1177/ SB 1115) – Created the Medication Compact enabling legislation.

Chapter 222 (HB 1592/ SB 851) – Clarified and defined when a Jockey is a covered employee for the purposes of the Jockey Fund.

Chapter 334 (HB 392/ SB 381) – Extended the sunset provision for Ocean Downs & Rosecroft to request \$1,200,000.00 – From the Purse Dedication Account for operation expenses through 2024

Chapter 767 (HB 130/ SB 32) – Deleted the sunset provision for VLT revenues that goes to the City of Laurel, Anne Arundel County & Howard County.

THE MARYLAND JOCKEY INJURY COMPENSATION FUND

The Maryland Jockey Injury Compensation Fund, Inc. was established by legislative action during the 1985 session of the General Assembly and became effective January 1, 1986.

The purpose of this fund is to purchase a blanket workmen's compensation insurance policy for all jockeys licensed by the Maryland Racing Commission and participating at the Maryland race tracks.

The above costs were funded by an assessment on all licensed owners and trainers levied and collected by the Maryland Racing Commission at the time of licensure. The assessment per licensee for 2018 was \$ 100.00, for 2019 was also \$100.00, and will remain \$100.00 in 2020.

MARYLAND-BRED FUND REPORT

MARYLAND-BRED FUND DISTRIBUTION IS EXPLAINED

The Maryland-Bred Fund was created by the General Assembly in 1962. Maryland was the first state to develop a legislated incentive program to encourage the improvement of Thoroughbred breeding and racing. Since that time, more than 30 other states have instituted incentive programs of one kind or another.

In Maryland, there are six categories through which monies from the Fund are made available: 1) **purse money** for stakes races for registered Maryland-breds, 2) **awards for owners** of registered Maryland-breds finishing first, second or third 3) **awards for breeders** of Registered Maryland-breds finishing first, second or third; 4) **awards for the owners of stallions** which are duly registered with the Maryland Horse Breeders Association (MHBA); 5) **yearling show bonus awards** for the four highest-earning 2 and 3-year-olds shown at the annual MHBA yearling show (based on North American earnings); and 6) **Maryland-sired allocation** for purses and awards for horses conceived in Maryland by a registered/nominated Maryland Stallion.

The Maryland –Bred Fund receives slightly less than 1 percent of the total mutual handle and breakage from Laurel and Pimlico (the State’s two mile tracks), and receives approximately 1.5 percent of the mutual handle and 5.0 percent of the breakage at Timonium (the State’s half mile track)

In 2018, revenue for the Maryland-Bred Fund totaled over \$7.9 million (includes approximately \$1.0 million from pari-mutuel wagering funds and \$6.9 million from other sources. After eligible deductions, a portion of this money is allocated to purses. The remaining percentage is distributed in the form of breeder awards and stallion awards. In 2018, \$620,000 was paid in purses and nearly \$5.2 million was disbursed as breeder and stallion awards.

In 2018, breeder and stallion awards were paid for the registered Maryland-bred who finished first through third in any race in Maryland. The breeder awards were 30% and the stallion bonuses were 10% of the winner’s share of the purse. For stakes races only, bonus percentages changed to 15% Breeders and 5% Stallion beginning in June

2018. In stakes races the award is based on the first \$100,000 of the gross purse. The Maryland-bred stakes program is typically planned on a meet by meet basis, and is based on projected revenues for the coming year.

The Maryland-Bred Fund program is administered by the Maryland Racing Commission with the assistance and advice of the Maryland-Bred Fund Advisory Committee chaired by David Hayden, a member of the Maryland Racing Commission. Other members of the Maryland Fund Advisory Committee are Georganne Hale (Representing the mile tracks), Richie Blue (half-mile track) and Michael Harrison, DVR (MHBA). Under the direction of the Commission, the actual implementation of the fund, including maintaining the Maryland-bred registry and computing and distributing all bonus awards, is performed by the MHBA for which it receives up to 10 percent of the total receipts of the Fund, subject to the approval of the Maryland Racing Commission.

Breeder and stallion award percentages are determined on a bi-annual basis on the advice of the Maryland Fund Advisory Committee. Owner award percentages are determined by a separate agreement. (For Maryland Million Day, breeder and stallion award percentages are determined annually). Awards are distributed as soon as is practical. The quality of Maryland-breds has improved since the Maryland-Bred Fund was initiated over 50 years ago and the program is evaluated bi-annually to ensure the most effective use of the money
