Senate Bill 183/House Bill 115

Under Senate Bill 183 and House Bill 115, the expiration date for the Mold Remediation Services subtitle of the Home Improvement Law will remain at July 1, 2019. Under the bills, if funding is not provided for implementation of the program, the program will terminate as scheduled on July 1, 2019, without further evaluation under the Maryland Program Evaluation Act or further action by the General Assembly. If funding is provided prior to the scheduled termination, the Department may submit legislation to reauthorize the program. The Sunset Review is allowing the Governor this time to make a decision.

House Bill 248/MHIC -Special Fund and Fees

This departmental bill establishes the Maryland Home Improvement Commission (MHIC) Special Fund in the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation (DLLR); repeals statutory licensing fees and instead authorizes MHIC to set fees by regulation; and redirects the licensing revenue associated with MHIC from the general fund to the new special fund. Penalty revenue and investment earnings continue to accrue to the general fund. Existing statutory fees remain in effect until new fees adopted by MHIC in regulation take effect. The bill takes effect July 1, 2018. The Commissioners are in favor of this Bill.

House Bill 1058

The bill will increase the amount from one-third to one half the maximum portion of a home improvement contract price that a person may receive as a deposit before or at the time of execution of a home improvement contract. The bill passed the House. One April 3, 2017, the Senate committee issued an unfavorable report. The Commissioners are not in favor of this bill.

House Bill 959

The bill will Recodify, in part, the definition of "door-to-door sale" as provisions that establish the application of the Maryland Door-to-Door Sales Act; altering the transactions to which the Maryland Door-to-Door Sales Act applies; etc. On March 31, 2017 the third reading was passed by the House.

Comments from the Executive Director

Mr. Finneran informed the Commissioners that he and Deborah Irvin-Cromwell, Assistant Executive Director, recently met with a senior group in Essex to inform them about the Maryland Home Improvement Commission. He also stated that he has met with a few contractor groups and had a booth set up at various locations to try to do more outreach and get the word out to consumers. Mr. Finneran stated that he would like to do more of this type of outreach and encourages anyone to contact him for a speaking engagement.
